Dear Colleagues,

The past academic year's training for colleagues was inevitably affected by COVID-19 and we swiftly moved to putting training and network meetings online, where we were able to deliver most of our CPD offer virtually. We acknowledge that the months ahead will involve some adjustment, however, our appetite for CPD and collaborative learning has not diminished, and we are pleased to present another high-quality set of courses.

Camden Learning recognises the powerful role that CPD plays in contributing to teacher recruitment and retention, as well as positioning CPD as support for professionals who want to learn on a continuous basis from respected subject specialists and school-based colleagues. Themes

Courses are placed in one of the four themes identified below, which are colour coded to ensure ease of selection.



Core

These core sessions have been specially selected by Camden Learning with the aim to develop and enhance skills across broad sections of curriculum areas. The core offer provides opportunities to utilise the rich and diverse skill set that we are fortunate to have across Camden's school colleagues and internal and external consultants.



Innovation

These sessions will capture creative ideas to respond to the ever-changing requirements of the teaching and learning landscape in our borough. Some of the courses have emerged as part of the immensely successful collaborative work from the Learning Hubs and bursary schools. They offer an opportunity for colleagues to gain and benefit from the learning that is unique to Camden. There is also a fresh and engaging offer from the CLC, to foster innovative thinking around computing and technology to support remote teaching and learning.



Leadership

The leadership offer aims to support and develop leaders at all stages of their careers, including those colleagues considering a path into middle leadership and those who are considering enhancing and developing their leadership skills and knowledge, leading onto senior leadership and headship positions. This includes support staff colleagues in - or looking to move into - middle or senior leadership positions.



Statutory

The statutory programmes form the essential CPD, moderation and oversight that is a necessary requirement to be completed by specific schools colleagues. The core safeguarding offer from the Camden Safeguarding Children Partnership is signposted here and is augmented by an online safety offer from the CLC. There is also a broad Health & Safety provision for colleagues in a range of roles.

Venues

Following on from the success of sessions hosted by schools this year, Camden Learning will be continuing to use Camden schools as venues for professional development courses.

This decision has been made in order to provide schools with some much needed income by reinvesting funding back to schools, as well as offering up the opportunity for school based colleagues to visit some of the excellent schools that we have in Camden.

Schools have been chosen for their accessibility, all are within a ten minute walk of an Underground or Overground station and many also have excellent bus links. As there is extremely limited and often no car parking at schools, it is highly recommended that

you use public transport. If this is not possible, please contact the school in advance of the session to request if there is car parking available nearby. Please see the map below showing the location of each school at which training courses are located.

As all schools have strict safeguarding procedures in place, when attending a course, it is essential that you bring along your school badge as a form of identification to enable you to enter the school's premises.

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Evaluation

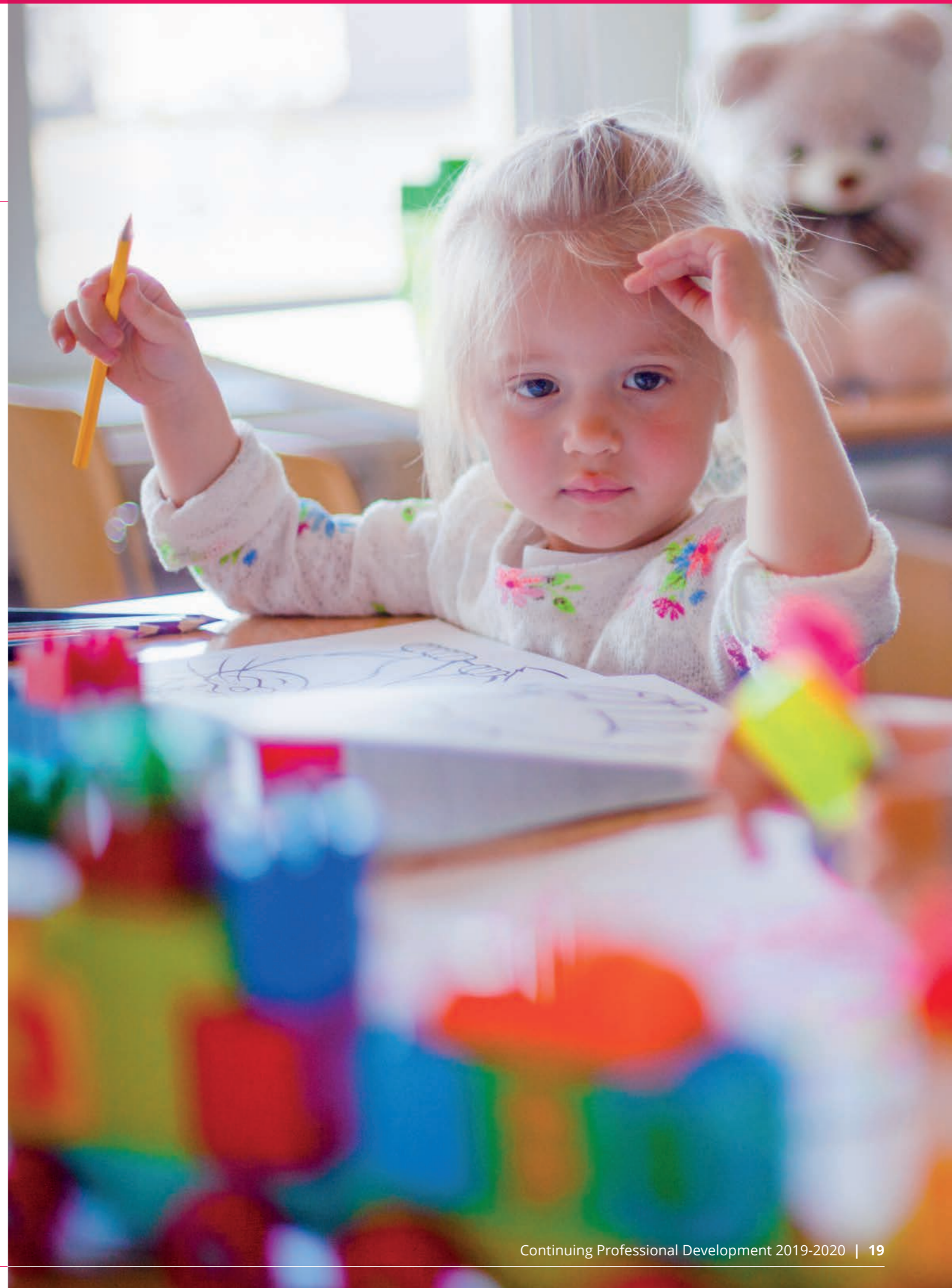

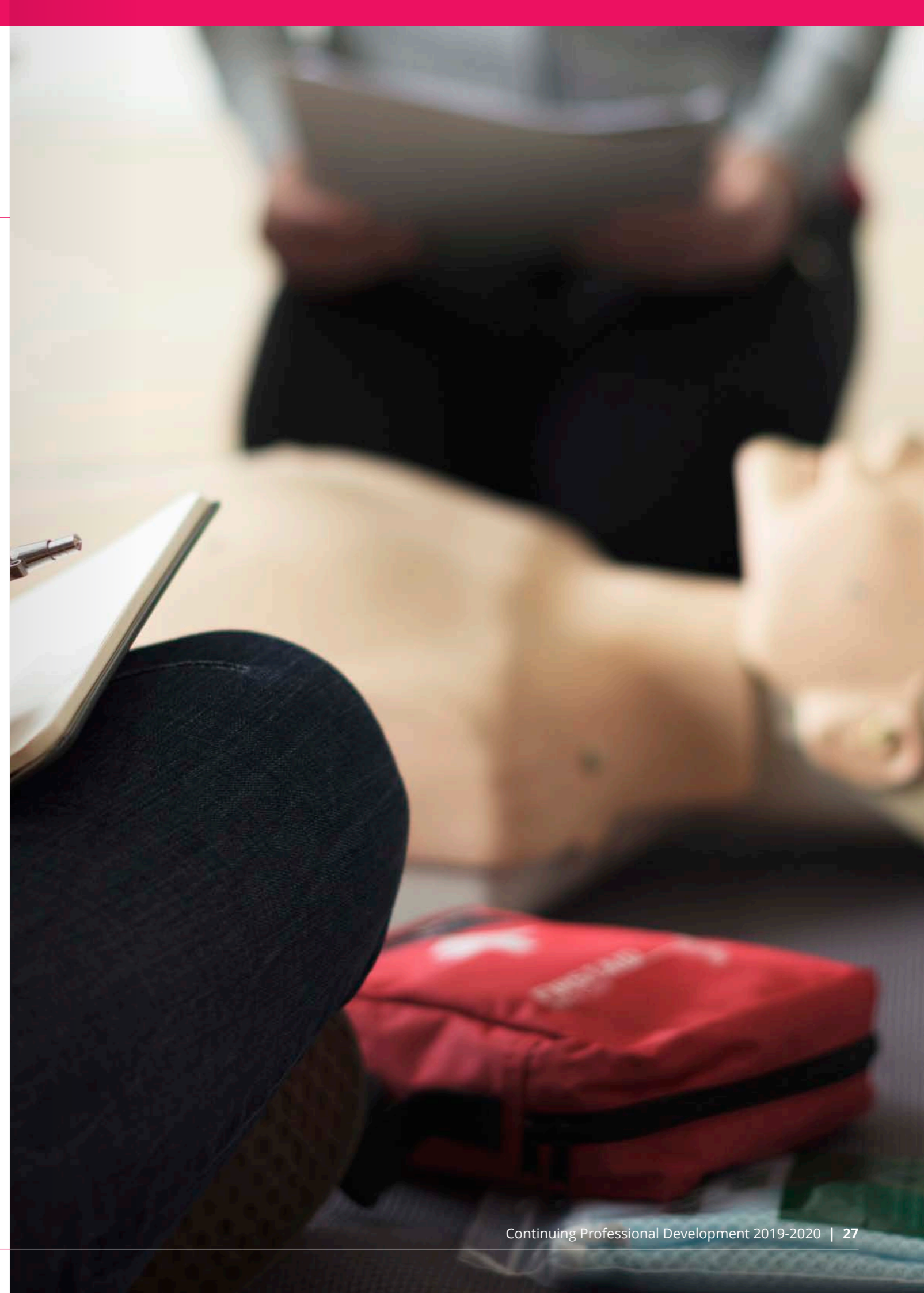

Safeguarding

Camden Safeguarding Children Partnership (CSCP) is made up of representatives from statutory, voluntary and community organisations and services. It ensures the coordination of safeguarding work by all agencies and monitors the effectiveness of child protection work across the local authority area.

Camden Learning works in partnership with the CSCP to promote effective safeguarding practice in all Camden schools and settings.

Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)

All schools should ensure an appropriate senior member of staff is appointed to the role of DSL, supported by a minimum of one Deputy DSL. This role is to take lead responsibility for safeguarding and child protection within their school and to be available during school hours for staff to discuss safeguarding concerns.

New DSLs appointments are required to attend DSL induction training, provided by Lynne Rigg (Independent Safeguarding and Child Protection Training Consultant), on behalf of the CSCP.

Experienced DSLs should attend refresher training every two years.

Should on rare occasions the DSL have missed the timeframe for training, completion of an online training module will satisfy compliance regulations. The expectation is for the DSL to enrol on the next available refresher course.

It is the responsibility of the DSL to:

1. Attend regular additional training, including Prevent awareness training
2. Attend termly DSL meetings in order to keep update with new guidance and emerging issues
3. Provides all staff with regular updates on any changes in safeguarding or child protection legislation or guidance
4. Ensure all staff, including temporary staff, receive safeguarding and child protection training at least every 2 years

Multi-Agency Training Courses

The CSCP provides additional multi-agency training courses and have no additional charges for individuals from schools to attend.

The CSCP website displays a calendar of events for courses. You will need to register your account before making any bookings.

Whole School Safeguarding Training

All staff should receive appropriate safeguarding and child protection training at least every two years, to provide them with relevant skills and knowledge to safeguard children effectively.

Externally delivered whole school training can be provided through Positive Learning, at a cost of £450 excluding VAT, for a half-day session.

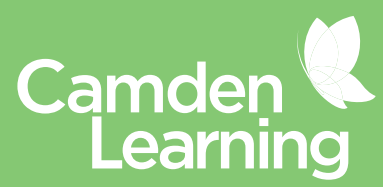
