Thanks for finding out more about this opportunity at the Portsmouth's New Theatre Royal. We hope you can be the one who helps shape our future. We are at the start of an exciting new chapter of our lives and of Portsmouth's cultural life and need someone who can help us realise our creative potential.

We want to appoint a visionary, creative, determined Artistic Director/ Chief Executive who shares our ambition and can realise our artistic and strategic vision, whilst creating a sustainable financial base from which we can build our future success. This is a real opportunity to revitalise and reimagine our theatre for the future.

Our new Artistic Director will turn us from a traditional receiving house into something special: a place that produces new work, involves our diverse community in what we do, inside and outside the theatre. You'll be guiding our next NPO bid, and, with the full support of the Board of Trustees and our partner organisation, building a new offer and a strong reputation for the Portsmouth New Theatre Royal.

The theatre occupies a beautiful building in the heart of Portsmouth. We have been on our current site since 1856, occupying a 700-seater venue designed by Victorian Theatre architects Charles Phipps and Frank Matcham. Alongside the Main Hall is a modern Studio Space named in honour of the director, producer and actor Anthony Minghella. That was opened in 2015, when, working with the University of Portsmouth and Portsmouth City Council, we re-built the back of the building.

We've faced a challenging time in recent years, and not just because of Covid. But we've dealt with some of our historic financial problems and weathered the national challenge of the pandemic. We are now seeking to re-build a sustainable theatre which adds to the city's rich creative and cultural offer: a theatre which builds a national reputation by producing its own work, but also one which is close to the local community, and which reflects Portsmouth's unique character.

Like the theatre, the City of Portsmouth faces its own economic and social challenges. But there are real opportunities for the right candidate to build a new audience for high quality productions, and to engage local people in the performing arts. Identified by Arts Council England as a Priority Place, Portsmouth has a variety of theatres, performance spaces and creative organisations. The newly established Portsmouth Creates offers a forum for bringing that creative energy together for the city's benefit.

We share a building with the University's Faculty for Creative and Cultural Industries, and there are exciting opportunities to develop our partnership with them. We also have links to many of our local schools, colleges and community groups, as well as nearby cultural organisations and venues, all of whom have a role in our future.

This is a tough job, it'll require not just vision, but hard work and determination. We believe that for the right person it can be a very rewarding role. After a difficult period in our history the theatre needs to establish itself as a centrepiece for culture in the city, a key part of our cultural ecology.

The next few years will see Portsmouth's New Theatre Royal evolve and grow, do get in touch with us for a chat if you want to be the one who shapes the theatre and our offer to the city, region and country.

Our values



Job Title: Artist Director / CEO

We are looking for a visionary, creative, determined Artistic Director/Chief Executive who can conceive, launch and deliver a socially responsible and financially sustainable creative future for our beautiful theatre.

Our Artistic Director will build an exciting and vibrant programme and create new work for our existing communities and those we do not currently reach. They will find new ways of collaborating with creative organisations across the city and region. And they will make Portsmouth proud of its oldest theatre.

We've faced a challenging time in recent years, and not just because of Covid. But we've dealt with some of our historic financial problems and weathered the national challenge of the pandemic. With levels of financial stability this role offers the opportunity to revitalise and reimagine our theatre for the future.

We will expect our Artistic Director to achieve the following objectives:

- Conceive an exciting creative vision which makes full use of the building and reaches out to communities across the city.
- Create a diverse and imaginative range of performances and activities which involves a broad audience, including producing up to 4 new shows a year.
- Ensure the theatre is financially sustainable and its staff have the skills and competences required to deliver our ambitious vision and meet the day-to-day challenges of managing a regional theatre.
- Work with our local community to give them the opportunity to create and participate in the performing arts, and to take our work out to the community.
- Build a programme of joint activity with colleagues in the University of Portsmouth's Creative and Cultural Industries Faculty, helping diversify our programmes.
- · Evolve and build relationships with community groups that are underrepresented in or current communities
- Maintain strong and lasting relationships with the theatre's key partners locally and nationally, and in particular Arts Council England, Portsmouth City Council and the University of Portsmouth.
- Develop an audience drawn from our city and region which reflects our local diversity and is representative of the global majority.
- Build a portfolio of financial supporters through grants and trusts, and by building strong and lasting relationships with other funders.

- Who works creatively alongside colleagues in the creative, educational and business communities across the city and region.
- With the passion to attract new financial supporters to the theatre, from grant-awarding trusts and foundations to philanthropic donors.
