LONDON BOROUGH OF MERTON APPOINTS

NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

John Morgan is appointed Executive Director for Adult Social Care, Integrated Care & Public Health having served as interim Executive Director.

Jane McSherry, previously Director of Children, Schools & Families, is assimilated into the role of Executive Director of Children, Lifelong Learning and Families.



Council Leader Ross Garrod said: "This administration has an ambitious and exciting agenda for Merton and we want to move at pace to deliver for our residents. Over the past year we've created a long-term vision for the borough, begun work on the borough's affordable housing programme, put in place capital funds to deliver our ambitions on civic pride, and launched a £2m cost of living fund to help residents.
