- Resident 'Voice' incorporated throughout, including engagement work from BAME voice, MenCap, AgeUK and Young Inspectors.




COVID-19 impact: expected total population fall for 2020




COVID direct impacts (Jan – Dec 2020)

Existing health and social inequalities amplified by COVID-19

- > COVID-19 deaths: 268
 - 88% aged 60+
 - ↑ East Merton
 - 38 in care homes
- > Excess deaths: 278
- ➤ 'Long COVID': **1,300**
- > Shielding: **13,680**
- > Furloughed: **38,200**

Start Well

Increase in vulnerabilities for children and young people and worse mental health due to COVID-19

Staying safe, enjoying & achieving

- ↑ Child poverty
- *Worsening parental mental health and substance misuse
- ↑ Domestic violence
- ↑ In child protection plans

Being healthy

- Poorer mental health
- High self-harm
- Healthy weight challenges:

Many residents have unhealthy lifestyles and poor mental wellbeing,

Obesity

- > Half residents overweight
- ➤ ↑ Food parcel use
- ➤ ↓ Physical activity



Smoking

- > 1 in 7 residents smoke
- ➤ ↑ Smoking cessation during COVID-19



Mental health

- > 1 in 5 report anxiety
- ➤ *↑ Loneliness
- > *Poorer mental health for those shielding

Assets

- Diverse green spaces
- Good transport links
- Low crime
- Good schools
- Resourceful libraries
- Active voluntary and community sector



Challenges

- Affordable housing
- Insecure employment (↑ in East)
- Air pollution
- Climate change
- Cycling infrastructure behind neighbouring boroughs
- Street drinking

Alcohol / drugs

- ➤ ↑ Alcohol-related admissions
- ➤ ↑ Nationally in drug-related deaths

Sexual health

- ➤ ↓ Service use during COVID-19
- ➤ ↑ Syphilis and Gonorrhoea pre-COVID
