


# **Top Talent: Housing**

#### **Subhan Ali** Service Lead for Strategic Housing and Development Blackburn with Darwen Council

Building strong communities is what drives Subhan, who has helped transform some of the borough's most challenging brownfield sites – bringing forward 450 new homes in the last three years alone.
