Now, UKSA is a leading youth charity and recognised maritime centre of excellence, dedicated to inspiring, educating, and equipping individuals for transformative careers and personal growth through sea-based learning and leadership experiences.

For nearly four decades, UKSA has delivered life-changing experiences, education, and training programmes to thousands of students. In the 2024–25 period alone, over 10,000 students embarked on their journey with us in Cowes, Isle of Wight, nearly one-third of whom received financial support, totalling nearly £1.5 million. We believe that traditional classrooms are not always the most inclusive or effective learning environments. Through challenging and immersive maritime experiences, UKSA empowers learners of all ages to overcome barriers, build confidence, and develop practical life skills.

ROLE PURPOSE

This position plays an integral and leading role in helping UKSA enact its strategic plan, ensuring the ongoing sustainability of the organisation and strengthening UKSA's finances through effective long-term business and financial planning This position will focus on the financial and capital planning of the next exciting phase of UKSA's development.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES:

Strategic Leadership

- Partnering with the Chief Executive and SLT (Senior Leadership Team) colleagues, FSC (Finance Sub-Committee) and Board of Trustees, supporting the organisation strategy and transformation plan; contributing subject matter expertise and looking for commercial, innovative and evidence-based solutions to improve effectiveness and performance
- Ensuring that the charity is aware of its accountability to its stakeholders and that all relationships are managed, monitored and considered in the development of the charity. These include external stakeholders, peer organisations and professional and statutory bodies
- Maintaining an up-to-date knowledge of leading practice in Finance and IT as it relates to the sector and keeping the CE
 and SLT informed of developments and how they impact the organization
- Driving commercial behaviour throughout the organisation with a key focus on improving access to financial information and financial resilience
- · Champion inclusive financial practices, ensuring equitable access to resources across the organisation

FINANCIAL & COMMERCIAL

- Leading UKSA's financial planning, forecasting and management reporting processes, ensuring that the organisation has plans in place to deliver against its ambitious strategic goals and financial targets
- Production of annual reports and accounts for the charity and its trading subsidiary to comply with the statutory
 accounting standards and recommended practice and Charity Commission rules
- Prepare and deliver the charity annual budget for approval by the CE and Board of Trustees
- Ensuring timely and accurate financial information is provided to enable effective decision-making at Trustee, FSC, senior and operational management levels
- Providing an external interface with banks, auditors, solicitors, investment managers, consultants, and charity finance specialists, including providing and/or coordinating all accounting, legal and taxation services and advice to the charity
- Being the custodian of the charity's system of financial controls, and ensuring that controls are fit for purpose and in line with recommendations of the Charities Commission
- Contribute to the development and delivery of new and existing programmes by providing financial modelling and analysis aligned with the organisation's product strategy
- Ensuring compliance with FCA rules in respect of Assisted Funding loans to students





REPORTING AND PERFORMANCE MONITORING

- Designing and overseeing the organisation's reporting infrastructure, including automated dashboards and data visualisation tools
- Monitoring and reporting against agreed KPIs, including financial performance, operational efficiency, and strategic progress
- Support the measurement and demonstration of impact by providing financial data and analysis that evidences delivery against the organisation's charitable objectives
- Provide financial modelling and reporting to inform and underpin the organisation's fundraising strategy
- Ensuring that reporting outputs are accurate, timely, and tailored to the needs of different stakeholders, including the CE, SLT, Trustees, and the Board
- Ensuring financial reporting supports clear, transparent, and accountable communication with internal and external stakeholders
- Championing data-driven decision-making across the organisation by embedding reporting tools into routine management practices
